

RATIONALE

he increase of population and change of lifestyle lead to the increase in complexity of waste management. The involvement and participation of all stakeholders (society, education institution, government, industries, private sectors, etc) are absolutely rquired to develop an effective and efficient system for managing waste. Moreover, waste should be considered as an invaluable resource for various products for environmental protection and conservation which is in line with the concept of sustainable development.

In many developed countries, waste has been an important resource having a high economic value. Synergy and integration among government regulation, people awareness, application of science and technology, is one of the key success for that. Their experiene, knowledge, and applied & developed systems may be used as a basis for developing models of waste management in other parts of the world, especially Indonesia.

For the above reason, Indonesia has been initiating a collaborative work with Sweden in the field of waste management and waste utilization/resource recovery known as *Waste Refinery*.

The collaboration has been in place since three years ago with the involvement of two education institutions (Gadjah Mada University, Indonesia and University of Borås, Sweden) and two local governments (Sleman Regency, Yogyakarta Special Province, Indonesia and Borås Municipality, Sweden). This collaboration covers various activities, including education, social awareness, research, and demonstration plant. This collaboration is expected to be expanded to the whole regions in Indonesia through a Waste Refinery Indonesia Network. Through this network, representatives of universities, local governments, NGOs, industries and other stakeholders from different regions can exchange experience, knowledge & perspectives and empower community related to waste management issue and propose a proper solution for respective regions. This network is also considered to be a very important media for dissemination and implementation of Indonesian Regulation on solid waste management (No 18, 2008) which has to be implemented in all regions by 2015.

AIM

This workshop provides a media for representatives of different regions to exchange experience on environmental and waste management and development of master plan of waste management in respective regions. Sweden experience, knowledge, and current environmental management system may be used as a model that can be shared during the workshop and may further be considered to be applied and adapted for the local condition.

EXPECTED OUTCOME

Following the workshop, it is expected that draft on environmental and waste management for some regions, which is in line with the concept of Regulation No 18, 2008, are developed. Additionally, the Waste Refinery Indonesia (WRI) Network is formally in place. At the local/region level, there are Waste Refinery Regions (eg. Waste Refinery Bandung, Waste Refinery Papua, Waste Refinery West Kalimantan, etc.) for the WRI to work more efficiently.
